

ABC Book Activity 2: Wee Spies Wee-phabets



Activity 2

Help reinforce identification of the letters of the alphabet, and increase listening and thinking skills as you and your child play “Wee Spies Wee-phabets”. In this game, your child will use knowledge about the letters of the alphabet to figure out which one is being “spied.”

Grades: All ages

Goals:

- Recognize and identify the letters of the alphabet
- Increase listening and thinking skills

Materials: *Mr. Wee and Boo’s Wee-phabet Adventure* by Danielle Rivera and Emmanuel Colliot, optional motivational tools such as a detective’s hat, magnifying glass, and colorful wax sticks.

Let’s Play:

1. Your child will pretend to be Detective Boo as he searches in the book to find the letter that Mr. Wee (the parent) spies.
2. Mr. Wee (parent) will give Detective Boo clues which describe the letter Mr. Wee spies. Example: Mr. Wee spies an uppercase letter. This letter looks like a tent, and it sounds like /ā/ /ă/ /ã/. Can you guess the letter Mr. Wee spies?
3. As you are describing (through clues) the letter of the alphabet that Mr. Wee spies, your child may use the children’s ABC book or Wee-phabet mat.
4. After your child figures out the letter, have him trace the letter with his finger (or use fun, colorful wax sticks), and say the letter’s name and sound.
