

ABC Song Activity 5: What Am I?



Activity 5

Your child will learn to identify consonants and vowels in the ABC game “What Am I?” This is another one filled with lots of movement, and the chance to practice listening skills. Learning the difference between vowels and consonants is important, and Mr. Wee and Boo want to make sure your child knows the difference between the two.

Grades: PreK – 2

Goals:

- Recognize, identify, and distinguish the difference between vowels and consonants

Materials: Mr. Wee and Boo’s Wee-phabet Songs With A Fun Twist (ABC song CD),
Wee-phabet flashcards

Let’s Play:

1. Separate the printable Wee-phabet flashcards into two stacks: vowels and consonants. Review each day which are vowels and which are consonants. (Tip: You can use highlighting tape or wax sticks to “flag” the difference.)
2. After your child has been introduced to the vowels and consonants, place the Wee-phabet flashcards (in order) on the floor or table, and start the ABC song “Oh, When the Vowels Go Marching In”.
3. As the ABC song is being played, your child points to the flashcards of the alphabet and must listen for and identify the vowels. When a vowel is heard in the song, your child holds up the card or jumps up and screams out the vowel that was heard.
4. Now switch things up a bit and repeat the above with consonants.
